## Conservatives Investing in Southampton

Gordon Brown and the last Labour Government wrecked the country's finances and the Coalition Government are faced with the difficult job of balancing the books and ensuring that the government lives within its means.

Despite the difficult financial backdrop the Conservatives have delivered millions of pounds of extra funding to Southampton, with an extra £30m of grants from central government last year alone.

### Extra Southampton funding has last year included:

- Extra money to keep the weekly bin collections and to introduce glass recycling.
- £7.5m extra for schools in the form of the Pupil Premium, helping schools to drive up results for children from less well off families.
- Over a million pounds to help support and turn around families - tackling school truancy, problems with drinking and drugs and long term welfare dependency.
- Over half a million pounds for extra free nursery provision.
- Over £10m to improve transport infrastructure, roads and public transport.



# WHERE IS THE PRIDE?



Despite promising no job loses at the city council, Labour have taken an axe to front line services in the city and over 500 hundred jobs have been cut.

The City Patrol service has been axed so we now face more fly tipping, graffiti and litter.

Streets are now only swept every

two months and some roads are full of litter.

The gutters are full of weeds and the roads littered with potholes.

Despite this Labour have found public money for trade union activists at £200,000 pa and to increase the number of paid jobs for Labour Councillors.

Labour have rejected calls by the Conservatives to reduce the number of city councillors by a third, a move that would save £300,000 pa!

One thing is obvious, Labour have no pride in our City!

## LABOUR'S PARKING FINES TOP £1,000,000

Labour's new city centre evening charges are costing local people a fortune.

People are being forced to leave work early to avoid the charges and are increasingly avoiding the city centre in evenings.

The introduction of

the new charges have been bungled with the signage unclear and as result thousands have received fines unfairly.

A recent Freedom of Information Request revealed that Labour have brought in £1,000,000 in fines this year alone.

### LABOUR PLANNING TO CLOSE WOODSIDE LODGE CARE HOME

Councillors have been offered briefings on the Labour run council's planned cut backs to adult social services in Southampton that are currently being consulted on.



This includes Labour's plan to close the Woodside Lodge Care Home in Wimpson Lane which mainly cares for people with latter stage Dementia.

Labour have announced that they want to stop all council run day care services in Southampton, including the services currently run from the Freemantle Community Centre in Randolph Street.

Labour are also looking to shut the council run respite centre in Kentish Road. The building provides residential accommodation for 70 adults with learning difficulties.

Local Conservatives raised



concerns at the last council meeting and Jeremy Moulton, who chairs the council's scrutiny panel, held a public meeting in September to look in detail at Labour's plans.

The meeting heard the concerns of care providers, service users and their families. Another scrutiny meeting will be held in December.

## LABOUR'S TAX RISES HIT RESIDENTS IN THE POCKET AND THREATEN THE CITY ECONOMY

The Labour Council have hiked up charges and taxes for residents across Southampton.

In the last 2 years they have brought in a raft of new taxes and charges:

- For garden waste collections; despite promising not to and receiving millions from the government to improve recycling!

- By hiking up Council Tax by the maximum possible and scrapping the pensioner discount, despite promising not to do either!

- New city centre & evening parking charges which threaten local businesses and damage the city economy.
